3. **Quiz:** Artist: Vangelis, Title: 1492 Conquest of Paradise.
4. **Task:**
 - 1 point: books on the theme of voyages of discovery that have nothing to do with seafaring.
 - 2 points: Novels
 - 3 points: Non-fiction/atlases
 - 4 points: Encyclopedias
 - 5 points: Books before 1950
5. 3 creative points for the kitschiest toy, all other crews get 1 point
6. **Quiz:** James Cook died in Hawai. He made a total of three voyages to the South Seas. He landed in the north of Australia, in Cooktown.
